### **A Golden Anniversary**

The Tri County Public Schools building opened fifty years ago in the fall of 1967. The following information comes from the *Tri County School Reorganization Plan* written by the steering committee and published in March, 1965.

*The building started out as a secondary building housing the students from DeWitt, Plymouth, and Swanton and a projected enrollment of 338 students. The original steering committee projected the cost of the building at approximately \$650,000 with \$100,000 needed to equip the building. The steering committee considered a bond of \$750,000 on a district valuation of \$12,000,000 would require a mill levy of about 4.1 mills. The original structure was projected to have 55,000 square feet of floor space for all of the planned needs of the present building and for future needs.*

From the time the original building was constructed, the elementary has been added and additional secondary classroom space has been added to the original structure. The Tri County campus remains the central figure of the district for the students, staff, parents, and patrons who comprise the school system. The buildings and grounds staff take great pride in the campus and work very hard to maintain an excellent setting that all can continue to be proud of now and for many years to come. Please take time to attend the many activities that are offered at Tri County and admire how the district has maintained the look of an excellent school district.

### **Lunch Update for Parents**

Tri County Public Schools has developed a lunch balance reminder process to eliminate the “sticker shock” when parents find out their child(ren) has/have a significant lunch deficit. Occasionally, parents find out about a negative lunch balance when amount is large and they have to play “catch up” just to break even. The USDA required all school districts to adopt a policy on how the district will keep parents informed about a lunch balance and how the district will handle negative lunch balances. The board of education adopted the following changes to policy #3013:

- The lunch room staff will remind students at +\$10.00 that their lunch balance is getting low when they purchase their daily meal.
- The foodservice manager will send an email to the parent(s) when the student has a balance of -\$15.00. If email is not available, a letter will be sent home to the parent(s) of the child.
- The building level principal will personally contact the student and the parent(s) when the lunch balance is -\$30.00. The principal will discuss and develop a plan for the parent(s) to reduce the negative lunch balance.
- The superintendent will personally contact the parent(s) when the lunch balance is -\$50.00. The superintendent will inform the parent(s) that the student will need to provide their own lunch until the negative lunch balance has been eliminated. The superintendent will also inform the parent(s) that failure or refusal of parents or guardians to provide meals for students may require mandatory reporting to child protection agencies as required by law.

To help parents make timely payments to a student’s lunch account, the district has partnered with eFunds to allow parents to pay their lunch account on line. Parents can go to the Tri County webpage and click on the eFund Payments quick link and set up an account for payment. If you need further information or help, please contact the elementary or secondary office. Parents can also set up automatic reminders when your child(ren)s lunch balance reaches a certain dollar value. The reminders will need to be set up in PowerSchool where the student information is stored.

## Standard Response Protocol

Tri County Public Schools has adopted a different response format for emergencies that could take place at school. The change stems from the Nebraska Department of Education endorsing a single plan for the state the is called Standard Response Protocol. With one emergency plan for all schools, students, staff, and emergency responders will know what to do when an emergency takes place in any school district. Every classroom has a new Safety/Security Manual in a holder by the classroom door. In addition, every classroom has at least two posters in the classroom that tells and show students and staff what to do in an emergency situation. Posters are also placed around the building as reminders to students when they are in the hall. During the school year the students and staff will practice fire drills, lockdowns, evacuations, and lockouts to familiarize everyone with the expectations of each situation. ## FROM THE DESK OF THE SECONDARY PRINCIPAL / ACTIVITIES DIRECTOR .... MATT UHER

As you know school is in full swing and our students have “hit a grand slam” with the manner in which they have approached the new year. The students are energetic and motivated to learn. Staff members are taking advantage of their enthusiasm and asking students to take an even more active role in their learning process. Students are using technology, being engaged learners, and taking advantage of our college credit courses offered through Peru State College and SCC. Our junior high students have seemed to adjust well and are preparing themselves for a successful school year.

I would usually write to you about NeSA test scores from last spring; however, the State of Nebraska is having some difficulty with a new scoring system, and the fact that we are no longer going to take the NeSA test. The NeSA test is now obsolete. We are now looking to take the non-NeSA which will be based on the MAP test our students have taken the past eight years. I believe once the State of Nebraska figures out the logistics of how the new test will look; our students will benefit from the data we will be able to collect. I'll provide more information on this topic as the year progresses.

I wanted to remind you again of our “Lounge of Opportunity.” Students who have missing work, an F or D in a class, or a zero must attend the “Lounge of Opportunity” to allow them specific time to work on the troubled area. You as parents/guardians must come and pick up your child (if they ride the bus) at 4pm. The students will notify you as parents if they will be attending the Lounge. If you have any questions, please call or come in and visit. This is to ensure students are held accountable for their learning. We believe strongly at Tri County that no student should fail. There are strategies and opportunities for all students to have success.

Just a reminder of our Grab and Go Breakfast we provide for our students in grades 7-12. Grab and Go is offered from 9:36-9:45 every morning and is a cost to the students of \$2. Remember if your child is free and reduced lunch and eats both breakfast and Grab and Go, your child would be charged full price for one of the meals. So, I ask you to please have that conversation with your child so that there is not a meal balance issue during the year. If you have questions please feel free to call.

I would like to remind everyone to stay up-to-date on your student's progress and to please use PowerSchool to communicate with their teacher. We are here to provide a positive and productive learning environment, and we appreciate when parents are involved in a manner that builds trust and positive relationships. We are here to prepare your child for a successful future. Students are also using Canvas which will assist in homework management as well.

Our students in grades 7-11 completed their MAP test during this month (End of August; early September). Remember this a test that allows us as educators to measure what your child has learned and needs to learn in the areas of reading, language, and mathematics. I would ask students get a good night sleep on those nights and prepare to give their best effort so that we can properly assess their knowledge and use this data to better serve them in the areas of curriculum and instruction.

Have a great month of September and come out and enjoy Tri County activities, which will be in full swing beginning this month! Be Relentless!

- ◆ If you have any questions or concerns that I can help with, please feel free to call or e-mail, [betsy.spilker@tricountyschools.org](mailto:betsy.spilker@tricountyschools.org). If I don't know the answer, I'll research it and do what I can to help!
- ◆ Senior Parents should be receiving emails from me. When I send the Senior students college/scholarship information I am also sending it their parents. Actually, Junior Parents: I also have an email group for you also! If you have a student in either age group and you haven't been receiving emails from me, let me know! I will add your email address to the group.
- ◆ There is an ACT Test scheduled for Sept. 9. Students should be registered for that already. The next test date is October 28 with a September 22 registration deadline. Look at the upcoming test dates carefully! The December and February test dates conflict with wrestling meets and the April date is Prom day! Don't think your child can wait for a later test date. Registration is online at: [www.act.org](http://www.act.org).
- ◆ Enrolling for Dual Credit Classes at Peru State is all online this year. Students in Senior English I and Calculus have already completed their application. Parents have to also give authorization online. So please, Senior parents, check your email for instructions! The students grumble over the \$60/credit hour class but that is cheaper than any other school in Nebraska, including 2 year technical colleges! This credit will transfer to the other colleges. Starting college with college credit is a big advantage when registering for classes.
- ◆ Seniors can complete their 2018-19 [FAFSA](https://fafsa.gov) beginning October 1 using 2016 tax data. This is a change from previous years when students had to wait until after January 1 and use tax data from the prior year. To help students prepare for the FAFSA, you must create a **Federal Student Aid (FSA) ID** (*one for the student and one for a parent*) at [fsaid.ed.gov](https://fsaid.ed.gov). The student and parent will each need an email address to create an FSA ID. The IDs are needed to access and sign the FAFSA.
- ◆ In October a Representative from Education Quest will be here helping with our annual Apply-to-College day. He will also share with the student information about college aid/scholarships. If parents want to hear this information also, that can be arranged.
- ◆ Sophomores and Juniors are going to attend "Explore It! Career Fair" on September 27. It is sponsored by the Nebraska Dept. of Labor and Southeast Community College. They will take a Career Assessment Inventory prior to the fair. That day they will attend workshops and meet individuals in careers that the Inventory matches them up with.
- ◆ October 4, Juniors and Seniors will be attending a College Fair at the SCC-Beatrice campus. This is an opportunity for them to meet with representatives from a number of schools in a short amount of time. If students haven't visited college campuses yet, this would be a good time for them to decide which schools they would like to visit. Seniors have 3 excused absence days to visit colleges, Juniors have 2. Please take advantage of this! If I can be of help in setting up visits, please let me know.
- ◆ I have also included information from Education Quest about another BIGGER College Fair. Seniors if you are having troubles deciding on colleges I would really recommend attending the one in Lincoln:

#### **Lincoln Area College Fair is September 24**

- Students and families can visit with representatives from nearly 110 colleges during the Lincoln Area College Fair, Sunday, September 24 from 1:00-3:00 p.m. at Southeast Community College, 8800 O Street. Admission is free.
- The College Fair, sponsored by EducationQuest Foundation and the Nebraska Association of College Registrars and Admissions Officers, will also feature financial aid presentations.
- Follow these tips to make the most of your College Fair visit:
- Before you attend, visit [NebraskaCollegeFairs.org](http://NebraskaCollegeFairs.org) to register for a barcode. Print the barcode and take it to the college fair so that college reps can scan it – and you won't have to complete information cards.
- Determine which colleges you want to visit (a list is available in the College Fair article at EducationQuest.org).
- Prepare a [list of questions to ask](#) college representatives. Ask about deadlines for admission, scholarship and financial aid applications.
