

RETURN TO LEARN FOR TRI COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS **2021-2022 SCHOOL YEAR**

Opening on August 17th with safety measures

- Masks are optional for students and staff
- Staff members will be provided with spray bottles w/ disinfectant
- Staff members will be provided with towels to wipe tables as needed
- Staff members will be provided with hand sanitizer for classroom use
- Students will be reminded of appropriate personal hygiene
- Gloves are available for staff members

Transportation

- All buses will be sprayed with a disinfectant as needed
- Students will be reminded to stay in their seat
- All buses will have hand sanitizer available when students board
- Parents may bring their child to school if they are concerned about close personal contact

Cafeteria

- Students will be reminded to use hand sanitizer prior to lunch
- Tables will be wiped down after each groups of students exit
- The salad bar will be available for use

Pre screening at Home

- Parents will pre screen students at home
- If needed, parents will keep student at home based on following symptoms
- Symptoms of temperature of 100.4, runny nose, cough, chills, muscle aches
- Contact local health provider for evaluation if parent feels it is necessary

Classrooms

- Wipe desks/tables as needed
- Part of routines/procedures should be personal hygiene reminders

Planning for “What if”

- Balance between under reacting and over reacting
- A single positive COVID test in a part of the building will not require TC to close
- Students who show symptoms will be evaluated by Tri County staff
- Students will be sent home if symptoms persist
- The Public Health Solutions will work with school for contact tracing
- Additional cleaning will take place in specific areas
- Staff need to plan with students for virtual learning
- Tri County may adjust the Ready to Learn plan based changes in medical recommendations
- Tri County may adjust the Ready to Learn plan based on changes in state requirements
